

Asphalt Resurfacing Program

October 2025

Works overview

The Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) will soon begin works to renew the asphalt layer to provide smoother travelling conditions and improve longevity on the Burnett Highway (Gayndah–Monto), on Philpott Creek Bridge near Moretons Road, in Philpott.

Works are expected to start in November 2025, and be completed by the end of December 2025, weather and other conditions permitting.

Resurfacing works will be undertaken at night to allow the road crew to complete the works as quickly as possible as traffic volumes are lower during these hours.

Night works will generally be undertaken between **6pm and 6am** from **Sunday to Thursday** to minimise disruptions and inconvenience to the general public.

Works will be delivered progressively, with the road returned to a trafficable condition each morning to allow normal road operations during the day.

On road signage will notify road users of specific dates and times in advance of works commencing.

What to expect

Nearby residents and businesses may experience some noise and dust while the works are underway, and while we understand the inconvenience this may cause, please be assured the department will work closely with its contractor to manage and minimise construction impacts as much as possible.

- Changed traffic conditions: Speed reductions, lane closures and detours may be in place during the works. Motorists are urged to drive to the changed conditions and obey all signage and traffic controllers' directions.
- Traffic delays: Motorists should expect delays and are reminded to observe traffic signage and be aware of changed conditions.
- Roadside parking restrictions: No parking will be permitted on the road shoulder within work sites during the specified work period to ensure the safety of motorists, efficiency of the works and to prevent vehicle damage.
- Private property access restrictions:
 Vehicle access to private property may
 be temporarily restricted within active
 sites for a short period of time. The team
 will endeavour to minimise any access
 restrictions and will advise any affected
 property owners of imminent access
 disruptions where possible.
